KODAK i600 Series Scanners Honored as Tops in the Mid-Volume Segment

ROCHESTER, N.Y., March 11, 2004 — A new line of high-speed digital document scanners from Eastman Kodak Company received a "Best of Show" award at the AIIM 2004 Conference & Exposition in New York City. The KODAK i600 Series Scanners, which convert paper documents to digital images at speeds of up to 120 pages per minute, received the "Best of Show" award in the mid-volume scanner category. The awards are organized by AIIM E-DOC Magazine but are determined by an independent panel of judges.

"This award validates our product strategy, which is to leverage our latest innovations in image processing technology and paper handling throughout our scanner portfolio," said Erwin Schwarzl, general manager & vice president, Document Imaging. "The customers will love the new i600 Series Scanners and it will further bolster our already market share-leading position in the mid-volume scanner segment."

The i600 Series offers exceptional price/performance, incredible image quality, super-fast image processing, reliable paper handling and excellent ergonomics. The scanners offer five output options -- bitonal, grayscale, color, simultaneous bitonal and grayscale, and simultaneous bitonal and color. Other features include Perfect Page with iThresholding, electronic color dropout, orthogonal rotation, three ultrasonic sensors to detect multifeeds, and SurePath paper handling. The three scanners in the series are the i620, i640, and i660, which range in speed from 80 to 120 pages per minute. The scanners will be available for customer shipment in April and have U.S. list prices ranging from \$27,000 to \$52,000.
